CHIEF OF SINNERS, LEAST OF SAINTS

Saint Boniface

Patron Saint of Germany, Brewers, and Tailors



St. Boniface was a Benedictine monk who dedicated his life to building the Catholic Church in Germany in the 700s. Originally from England, he was sent to continental Europe to serve as a missionary in the eighth century. Boniface came to Germany in the middle of many regional wars, a situation that he would try to stabilize in his preaching. While he worked to convert the pagans in Germany, many sects vied for Boniface's loyalty, but he remained loyal to the pope and the Church. In 754, he was martyred by one of the groups he had worked with for years. Every year there are celebrations for his feast in Germany, Netherlands, and England.

POP26 – RECONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Comfort Pro will begin the insulation work on June 8. We are awaiting a schedule from Servpro for restoring the drywall and final painting. We have begun the process of selecting carpeting and the installer.

The framework for our corner pantry is roughed in, and it is looking good! We want to extend an extra “thank you” to Mike Check for heading up this portion of the “new” build within our rebuild.

NOURISHING NEIGHBORS

The Nourishing Neighbors group would organize and prepare meals for Prince of Peace families who are currently dealing with medical or health needs. SECOND SUNDAY FELLOWSHIP HOSTING A FLOOD OF FELLOWSHIP (formerly known as our Second-Sunday fellowship) is still happening. This is when we gather as a community immediately after our Second-Sunday service to enjoy treats, welcome new people, and check in with friends. The reason for the name change is that we are raising funds for the flood reconstruction project, POP26. The “flood of fellowship” boat will be docked at the table for those who are willing to give a monetary donation. Every little bit helps.

Initially, the church was reimbursing hosts up to \$50 but **now we have a Thrivent Action Team grant for each fellowship where you can spend up to \$125!**

Who Prepares Fellowship Hour? Anyone can be a fellowship host! Have a buddy in Women’s Ministry you like to work with? Want an opportunity to let people know about Music Ministry? Consider teaming up with a friend or recruiting your family.

 - April minutes – Correction to April minutes, End of year gathering with First Baptist Church is on May 20th. Gary Stangland made a motion to approve, Donna Try seconded. Motion carried.

Board Reports

A. Elder (Gary Stangland):

- Quarterly giving statements will go out in June. Gary and Deb came up with a blurb to put in the newsletter explaining.
- Updating the Usher and Greeter list of responsibilities. Maybe looking for some new volunteers
- Talking to a possible new Elder. They will be attending the next Elder Meeting.
- May 27th is the next meeting

B. Missions (Donna Try):

- Completed Events: Four Community Dinners, Swing into Spring fundraiser for the youth
- Upcoming Events: Community Dinner (5/21), A Flood of Fellowship Funds will be used for May and June.

C. Trustee (Chris Borgmann):

- The last part of the demolition is happening tomorrow.
- Insulation for the classrooms, coffee house, and Sanctuary will be going in May 26th – 29th.
- LaForce will be running wiring for the door security upgrades before the insulation goes in. The cost will be approximately \$3700.00, this will come out of the Maintenance account.
- NEI [Electric] bid for wiring the pantry (\$1900.00) and classrooms (\$3000.00). They would start mid to late June. Classroom portion may be covered by insurance.
- ServPro will start drywall and painting in June. Insurance should cover most of this.
- The POP 26 project is expected to be completed early July.

 - i. Need to get a proposal for new flooring to the insurance company. Gregg asks for motion to move forward with carpeting solution, Gary Stangland motions, Pastor Gomez seconds. Motion carried.

- Designated Funds – Gary Stangland and Jim Hinnenthal will review the current designated accounts and their effectiveness. They will discuss their ideas with Pastor Gomez and then make recommendations to the Board.
- Gary Miller is looking into what upgrades may be needed to the sound system in the Sanctuary. We will be getting a bid for possible upgrades.
- Security – Need to upgrade door security, know who has access to the building
